In the City Camps Health & Safety Plan for ITC Clusters

The following document outlines operational recommendations for ITC Clusters. The recommendations are in accordance with the American Camping Association (ACA) recommendations as well as the Executive Order of the Governor of Georgia.

Based on these guidelines, the following is recommended for safe operations:

1. Camp should occur at the designated location only to ensure that ITC has space dedicated solely to camp activities.
2. Camp should run for 3 hours at a time, 2-5 p.m.
3. Campers and staff will be grouped into clusters of 4-5 children and 1 counselor. These clusters will remain together only and will not commingle with other clusters.
4. Maintaining social distancing guidelines is the key indicator for how many children can attend camp. Current state guidelines limit sizes of groups to 20. An assessment of the space will determine the maximum number of campers that can fit in the space.
5. While current state guidelines limit sizes of groups to 20, it is recommended that each individual cluster include 4-5 campers and 1 counselor each. This will allow for activities to better focus on the emotional and social reintegration into peer groups.
6. Activities should be run outdoors. Indoors should only be used in the case of severe weather. Social distancing, group size, and PPE should be utilized in these cases.
7. There will be no buses, field trips, tours, or visitors this summer.
8. Cleaning and disinfecting should occur at regular intervals as outlined throughout the document, most notably before and after each block.

The following details outline operations ITC Clusters that are specific to COVID-19. These operational recommendations are necessary for compliance with ACA recommendations and the Executive Order of the Governor of Georgia.

Camp Entry Screening

Screening of all campers and staff will occur on a daily basis at the start of each day.

- As the child is dropped off in carpool:
 - Check temperature using a touchless forehead thermometer
 - Symptom check
 - If a camper or someone else in the household is experiencing ANY symptoms of COVID-19, do not come to camp. Our cancellation policy will be more flexible this year in order to keep our campers, counselors, and community safe.
 - Caregiver will not get the ok to leave carpool lane until screening is complete.
- Staff is trained to identify symptoms of COVID-19 throughout the camp day.
- Plan for positive screen:
 - If the positive screen occurs at the beginning of the day (in carpool), the child will go home immediately with the caregiver.
 - If the positive screen occurs during the course of the day:
 - The camper will be taken to our designated location for isolation for suspected illness to await caregiver arrival while under health staff supervision.
 - A face mask will be placed on the child immediately.
 - The child may not return to camp until permitted by medical consultant.
- Staff or campers can only return after a negative COVID-19 test or if they have been fever free (without medication) for 72 hours; and at least 10 days since symptoms first appeared; medical consultant makes final call for admittance back to camp.

Preventing Spread at Camp

- Hand hygiene
 - Campers and staff will use hand sanitizer upon entrance to camp.
 - There will be a hand sanitizer station located at the tent and regular use will be planned into the camp day.
 - Hands must be washed and then sanitized at bathroom breaks.
 - Hands must be sanitized at snack breaks.
- Coughing etiquette (how to cough away from others or in the crease of the elbow) will be reviewed with campers each day.
- Physical distancing
 - Use of cohorts/bunks:
 - Children will be divided into clusters. All children in the cluster will participate in all activities together and will not cross over with other groups. Physical distancing will be maintained during activities.
 - ITC will have 4-5 campers and 1 counselor per cluster.
 - Depending on the activity, physical signs showing appropriate distancing will be used.
- Transportation plan
 - All campers should be driven to camp daily by one of their primary caregivers; carpooling is discouraged.
 - We will have staggered arrival and departure times to reduce density, if necessary.
 - The carpool times will be staggered by cluster as much as possible.
 - Carpool staff should wear a mask while performing this duty due to the possibility of being unable to maintain physical distancing at this time.
 - Caregivers must remain in their vehicles during drop off and pick up and are not permitted at camp.
 - We will have a contactless system for check in and check out.
- PPE
 - All campers should bring a mask in their backpack each day (can be a cloth mask).
 - Masks and other PPE should be available to staff based on activity, function, and location.

Cleaning/Disinfection of Grounds

- There are two stages of cleaning procedures: cleaning and disinfecting
- Cleaning will occur with the following regularity:
 - All surfaces will be cleaned and disinfected at the beginning and end of all group activities.
 - If there are multiple groups using an area, surfaces will be cleaned between groups.
 - High touch surfaces should be cleaned at a higher frequency.
 - This includes bathrooms, doorknobs, tabletops.
 - Bathrooms will be cleaned and disinfected after use every day.
- Cleaning during activities
 - All items used during activities be cleaned and disinfected between camper use.

Please note: We will update our policies and procedures as necessary based on the most recent public health information and guidelines.
